It is with great pleasure to celebrate National Transport Month

with you.

Ladies and gentlemen, we are gathered here this morning to

tackle important issues. Today, we want to encourage road

safety and respect amongst drivers, commuters and

pedestrians.

This prayer session will also create a platform to strengthen

relations between government and the taxi industry.

As we celebrate national Transport Month, eThekwini has

planned a series of road safety awareness campaigns to be

held throughout the month.

Also during this month, progress made on GO! Durban will be

highlighted. We must rally behind the transformation of

society through the delivery of safe and reliable public

transport.

Ladies and gentlemen, road accidents and road fatalities are of

great concern to government. In the period of January 2014

and August 2016, over 5 thousand accidents have happened in

eThekwini involving public transport vehicles.

About 63 percent of these accidents are caused by drivers

braking suddenly, following too closely, changing lanes

haphazardly and turning without indicating.

About 70 percent of fatal accidents involve pedestrian. These happen when a pedestrian is crossing or walking on the roadway and drivers fail to slow down.

The 5 most common causes of accidents are:

- 1. Dangerous lane changing.
- 2. Following a vehicle too closely.
- 3. Reckless overtaking.
- 4. Failing to keep left on the roadway and approaching oncoming traffic.
- 5. Reversing when it is not safe to do so.

So ladies and gentlemen, we want to strengthen our partnership with the Greater North Taxi Region to curb road accidents.

Government is committed to working with the taxi industry, to minimise road accidents and to promote the industry's contribution to economic growth.

Through your service thousands of commuters are able to travel to work, school and social activities daily. This service moves people around efficiently because you are part of the viable public transport system of our City.

The partnership between government and the taxi industry ensures that the industry operates in a manner that is viable, efficient and sustainable. Like other sectors of the economy, your industry has its own unique challenges.

Such cooperation will ensure that together we can resolve challenges without eroding the positive gains that have been made to capacitate this industry which is the backbone of our economy.

With those few words, I am confident that through our combined efforts we will build a connected and prosperous City.
