Good evening, Sanibonani,

I would like to take this opportunity on behalf of the Mayor and people of eThekweni and welcome you to this beautiful and wonderful city of Durban.

This event comes after announcements by MEC for Economic Development, Tourism and Environmental Affairs in KwaZulu-Natal, Mr Sihle Zikalala. This morning the MEC announced that

there is more than R200 billion which will be pumped into the economy of KwaZulu-Natal in the next few years. This will create about 800 000 temporal jobs during the construction and development phase of the projects and a further 410 000 permanent jobs in the short to long term.
