# REQUEST FOR QUOTATIONS

The eThekweni Municipality's Communications Unit invites eligible and accredited service providers to submit written quotations for the following services:

Provision of an online digital publishing platform that can swiftly convert print ready newsletters/reports/policies/brochures/flyers/etc, into electronic version that can:

1. Create a realistic page flipping digital publications of about 100+ Municipal reports, newsletters, flyers, etc
2. Track usage analytics per digital document
3. Integrate audio visual functionality within documents
4. Distribute and integrate content to various social media platforms, other websites and email
5. Provide search functionality across all publications.

For the purpose of adjudication, Communications Unit will give consideration to the responsive bidders. Bidders should include samples or links to previous work similar to the above and contactable references of previous engagements.

Responsive tenders will be evaluated utilising the 80/20 system, where a maximum of 80 points will be awarded for tendered price and functionality, and a maximum of 20 will be awarded for procurement empowerment points.

Failing to register on the National Treasury's database will result in your business being non-compliant with the legislation and as a consequence will not be permitted to transact with eThekweni Municipality.
